A watermill is mentioned at Thrussington in the Domesday Survey. The mill ceased working in 1910 and the grinding gear was taken out during World War 2 but the all wooden wheel survives. The wheel is of the undershot type, about 12 feet in diameter and five feet wide and drove three pairs of grinding stones.
