1274/2024 - Resolution to receive apologies for absence

1275/2024 – Resolution to receive declarations of interest on items on the agenda

- Cllr Watson declared an interest on planning as a neighbour of the Hoby Road pre application.

1280/2024 – Planning applications

- It was reported that comments have been submitted for the Hoby Road appeal.
- It was reported that amendments have been made to the Old Gate Road application which includes increasing the roof height.
- Cllr Watson reported that Charnwood Borough Council have received comments from the inspector and there are no changes to the plans we submitted about ensuring some of the land was not assigned for planning. It was noted that borough councillors have elected to speak at the plans committee.
- Cllr Watson reported that any s106 monies have not yet been agreed but that there could be a contribution towards transport, the health service and the education authority. Councillors agreed that we should start to consider what we would want to see in the village as a benefit of s106 monies.

1281/2024 – To discuss options for community assets and agree actions

Following a discussion regarding the Blue Lion Public House and its recent sale for conversion into residential dwelling the parish council agreed to seek clarification on the process for nominating properties/land as community assets and if a property has recently been sold can it still be added.

1282/2024 – Update on the speed sign

- The clerk reported that we have now received confirmation from Swarco that they do not have a contract with LCC highways to install the signs and that we need a specific licence to do this. The clerk is waiting for a response from highways.
- It was noted that we do need to confirm a team of volunteers who will move the signs it was agreed that an article will go in Thrussington Life.
